

POST SURGEON

Hello, Fellow Comrades and Families!

How are you enjoying this warm weather we've been getting? I know my boys and I are definitely taking some time to be outside. With nice weather comes the chance to be outdoors enjoying the sun, nature and friends. With those come sunburns, bugs and dehydration, so let's get on top of those problems by staying ahead of them. Please make sure with the surge in heat that you are drinking enough clear liquids (water preferably), using sunscreen and bug repellant. Sunscreen will hugely decrease your chance of sunburn and skin cancer and I'd sure like to have you all around for a LONG time. :-) Bug repellant will be handy for those cooler mornings and evenings to avoid those itchy bug bites and the potential for infection they can bring.

A few tricks I've tried over the years for itchy bug bites are: Benadryl, lavender essential oil, nail polish (to keep air from the site), ice and I'm sure you've heard and tried a few other ways to avoid itching and making those bites worse. The more you scratch the more likely you are to invite infection into the area, so let's not scratch those itches. Prevention is better and there are some good bug sprays out there, but if you're using a DEET spray please only apply that to your clothing and not your skin!


