

ARTICLE VI COMMITTEES AND DUTIES

Sec. 1 In compliance with Sec. 216, of the National Manual of Procedures, the Commander, on the night of election or as soon thereafter as possible, shall appoint the Adjutant, Officer of the Day, Service Officer, Guard and such other officers, chairmen and committees as he deems appropriate to properly conduct the affairs of the Post.

The chairmen must meet any and all State, County or City regulations regarding his or her committee chairmanship before managing any such committee. The Commander shall, by the same section 218, be a member of all committees. The Post Quartermaster, by virtue of his office, shall be the Treasurer of all committees handling funds.

Sec. 2 The Standing Committees of the Post shall be as follows:

- a. Americanism
- b. Community Services
- c. Budget
- d. Education
- e. Hospital
- f. The House Committee

The House Committee is elected by the Post. Duties are to include proper operation of the Canteen and upkeep of the Post Home and its property.

- g. Legislative
- h. Membership
- i. Poppy
- j. POW/MIA
- k. Publicity
- l. Relief/Veterans Services
- m. Safety
- n. Youth Activities; including Voice of Democracy and Patriots Pen
- o. Web Master
- p. Any other Committee(s) deemed needed by the Post Commander, according to Article 6 (VI) of the National By-Laws to properly conduct the affairs of the Post.

ARTICLE VII CONTROL OF SUBSIDIARY UNITS

Sec. 1 Any activity, unit or clubrooms sponsored, conducted or operated by the Post, incorporated separately from the Post or unincorporated, shall be at all times under the direct control of the Post.
